

Information for Walkers

Your rights of way are:

- Public footpaths – on foot only
- Bridleways – on foot, on horseback or on pedal cycle

On rights of way you can:

- Take a pram, pushchair or wheelchair, if practicable
- Take a dog (On a lead or under close control)
- Take a short route around an illegal obstruction or remove it sufficiently to pass.

For your information:

Obstructions, dangerous animals, harassment and misleading signs on right of way are illegal – you should report them to the County Council. Paths across fields can be ploughed, but must normally be reinstated within two weeks. Landowners can require you to leave land to which you have no right of access.

Wherever you go, please follow the country code:

Enjoy the countryside – respect its life and work

Leave livestock, crops and machinery alone

Keep your dogs under close control

Take special care on country roads

Protect wildlife, plants and trees

Fasten all gates

Take your litter home

Help to keep all water clean

Guard against all risk of fire

Make no unnecessary noise

Keep to public paths across farmland

Use gates or stiles to cross fences, hedges and walls
